## Overview & Purpose- Mission

***Question of the day: What does Jesus want from me?***

### **VERSE**

**I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing. John 15:5**

Read the verse with the kids and ask them our question for the day. Please be sure to point out the clue in your room and ask the kids what other clues they have found so far.

Ask the kids to share some things that they know about what Jesus wants them to do and what they are learning so far. We want this time to be less of a lesson and more of a conversation. We want a chance for the kids to think through these ideas and voice their thoughts. Encourage them to ask questions. Ask the kids to think of different ways that they could love

people and talk about Jesus in different jobs they could have. How could you love people and talk about Jesus if you were a doctor? How could you love people and talk about Jesus if you were a firefighter?

Today we are making a prayer jar for you to practise praying at home. We want you to write down your prayers and put them in your jar. Then when God does something, we want you to write that down too. God does amazing things when we pray!!

## Materials Needed

Plastic container with a lid, paper strips (2x6 inches), glue or tape, stickers

Each child gets a container to decorate with stickers, paper etc. Then the kids will get 8 slips of paper to put in their jar. Remind the kids that they are going to write prayer requests on one side of the slip and then when God does something, they are going to write how God answered it on the back side. Tell the kids that it is so important to remember what God has done for us and how He hears our prayers.
